Formerly designated as WKIX, and still broadcasting at 1320 kilocycles, the station's new call letters have been adopted, effective today, to emphasize the fact that the CBS affiliate in Columbia is operating under new ownership and management. The change of ownership was completed last Wednesday, when the broadcasting station was purchased for \$100.000 by the state-chartered Marseco corporation from Intercity Advertising company of Columbia, Inc.

Under the former call letters of WKIN, the CBS outlet in Columbia first went on the air in June. 1945. It was owned and operated by the Inter-City Advertising Company of Columbia, Inc.
